## **Examination: Political Science Ba (A): International Politics,**

This examination consists of 10 questions. The grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx and F can be given on the examination. On this scale the grades A through E represent pass levels, whereas Fx and F represent fail levels. The total available points are 40, and to pass the exam 20 points are needed. The levels of points for the pass grades are as follows: A=36, B=32, C=28, D=24, E=20. The allowed time for working with the examination is a maximum of 5 hours. Answers can be given in English or Swedish. Dictionaries are allowed to be used during the examination.

Question 1. Describe what is meant with the term Security Dilemma? 2 points.

Question 2. According to the course literature two categories of cyber crime, or netcrime, have become major transnational issues. Name the two categories. 2 points.

Question 3. Why do most international relations theorists date the contemporary system from 1648? 3 points.

Question 4. The course literature discuss the sources of international law. Name three sources of international law. 3 points.

Question 5. The course literature describes an accepted definition of war. Describe the three factors that are included in the definition. 3 points.

Question 6. Describe the difference between imperialism and colonialism. 3 points.

Question 7. The central UN organs (principal organs of the United Nations) comprises of six major bodies. Name four of the six major bodies. 4 points.

Question 8. Describe the conflicts between the rights of refugees and the rights of states to protect their borders and national security. 4 points.

Question 9. How can we identify an aggressor in international conflicts? Is such identification important? Why or why not? 6 points.

Question 10. Choose a current event in world politics. Describe and explain that event using the three levels of analysis (individual level, state level, international system level). 10 points.
